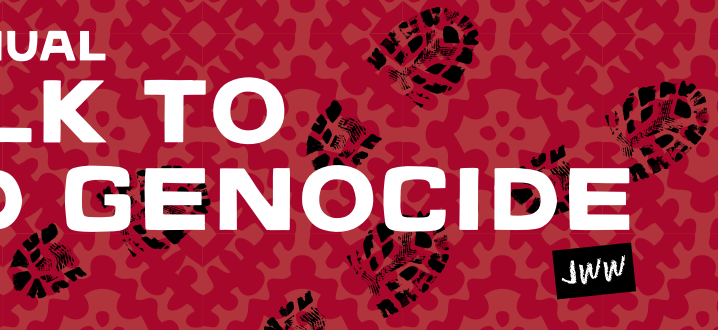




# 4<sup>TH</sup> ANNUAL WALK TO END GENOCIDE
